Your Council would like to provide you an update of what's happening with respect to the Christian Reformed Church here in Emo this week:

- Our service is planned for this Sunday, November 22. The Worship Committee continues to work alongside Pastor Marno to plan Sunday services. The service would include a controlled entrance and exit policy and physical distancing measures will continue to be in place. Face masks will be provided in the foyer if you need one. Please do not attend if you have a cough, fever, or do not feel well.
- There WILL BE Sunday School provided during our worship services for children Age 3-Grade 3. At this time, we WILL NOT have Sunday School at church for Grades 4-8. Each week, lesson material will be emailed to all families with school-age children. The material sent home will be flexible, easy to understand, and cover a range of age groups.
