# The Name of God

Who is the God revealed in the Bible? Who is this God who calls us to believe in him? When we study the Bible, one of the first things God reveals about himself is the fact that He is a personal God. How do we know this? Well, the Book of Exodus records that God revealed his name to the people of Israel. But why is God's decision to reveal his name to Israel so significant for our faith? How does this connect to God being a personal God? Well, if you really want to get to know someone, what's usually the first thing you do? You ask their name. In the context of ancient Israel, names had much greater significance than they do in our contemporary society. Old Testament scholar, Bruce K. Waltke, explains their significance this way:

Names in the ancient Near East provide insights into the nature, character, prospect, hope, and destiny of the person bearing the label; they are not merely euphemistic labels of identification, as is often the case in our culture. (*An Old Testament Theology*, 2007)

By revealing his name to Moses and to Israel, God revealed something of his character and identity, but he also revealed himself as a personal God. In ancient Israel, knowing someone's name was equal to entering into a relationship with them. By sharing his name, God invites people in a relationship with him. He's not some anonymous, disinterested God, far removed from the realities of life. No, He's a God who chooses to be personally involved in his creation. By sharing his name, God signals that he wants to make himself known to us and invites us to call on him by name, to communicate with him personally.

It's because He is a personal God that God also expects a personal response from us. I love the way Jonathan F. Bayes describes this personal dimension of a believer's relationship with God:

The wonderful fact is that he who is above all things is the personality from whom all personhood derives its reality. The one who, as God, is over all, is the very one into whom I have placed my believing confidence because he has, in incalculable kindness, made himself known to me, not as a force or power, but as the lover of my soul. (*The Apostles' Creed: Truth with passion*, 2010)

Throughout the course of the Old Testament and New Testament, God steadily revealed himself to his people, under various names and titles. However, the most important revelation for our understanding of God's name is the divine name God revealed to Moses. In the Book of Exodus, written some time between 1446 BC and 1260 BC, we read about Moses' life-changing encounter with God at Mount Horeb. God appears to Moses in a burning bush and commands him to lead the people of Israel out of Egypt. It's in the context of this divine encounter that Moses asks God to reveal his name. In Exodus 3:13-14 (CSB), we read,

Then Moses asked God, "If I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' what should I tell them?"

God replied to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: I AM has sent me to you." God also said to Moses, "Say this to the Israelites: The Lord, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you. This is my name forever; this is how I am to be remembered in every generation.

God reveals his name with four Hebrew letters, YHWH (YUD-HEY-VAV-HEY). This divine name of God is sometimes referred to as the *tetragrammaton* (the term *tetragrammaton* being a Greek word which means "four-letter name"). Some

people believe the divine name should be pronounced as YAHWEH, some say YEHOVAH, others say YAHWOH. Still others argue that the name cannot and should not be pronounced at all. But what is the meaning of the divine name? Most biblical scholars argue that the divine name means "I AM WHO I AM", but it could also be translated "I AM WHAT I AM" or "I WILL BE WHAT I WILL BE". Nonetheless, the basic meaning of the divine name seems to be that God is a God who is always the same – completely reliable and unchanging in nature. Still, the exact meaning and pronunciation of the divine name remains a mystery, and rightly so. No matter how much we think we know about him, God will always remain a mystery to us. On the one hand, God reveals his name – he makes himself known, but on the other hand, he remains the God who is indescribable, above and beyond anything we could ever imagine.

As we encounter this awesome God, we become aware of just how sinful we are and just how holy he is. While the Bible reveals God as a personal God who wants to be close to us, it also reveals him as an utterly holy God. Scripture records many examples of the fear and wonder of those people who came face to face with the holiness of God. While encountering God in the burning bush, Moses removed the sandals from his feet, realising he's standing on holy ground (Exod. 3:5). Moses became so aware of the holiness of God that he "hid his face because he was afraid to look at God" (Exod. 3:6, CSB). On another occasion, Moses asked to see the glory of God (Exod. 33:18), but God replied, "You cannot see my face, for humans cannot see me and live" (Exod. 33:20, CSB). The prophet Isaiah was granted a vision of God seated in his holy temple, a vision that made him intensely aware of his sinfulness. In the presence of the all holy God, Isaiah cried out,

"Woe is me for I am ruined because I am a man of unclean lips and live among a people of unclean lips, and because my eyes have seen the King,the Lord of Armies. (Isa. 6:5, CSB)

We might be tempted to think there's no chance of forgiveness for us in the presence of such a holy God. However, it's this very same holy God who is also merciful and gracious God. He forgives the person who recognises that they are a sinner before God. In Exodus 33, God reveals his merciful nature to Moses with the following words: "The Lord – the Lord is a compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger and abounding in faithful love and truth, maintaining faithful love to a thousand generations, forgiving iniquity, rebellion, and sin" (Exod. 33:6, CSB). This revelation of God's mercy and faithful love connects to his revelation of himself as "I AM WHO I AM". Despite our frequent failings and sinful deeds, God remains faithful to us.

Nowhere is God's faithful love more evident than in his decision to offer up his only Son for us. As John 3:16 (CSB) puts it, "For God loved the world in this way: He gavehis one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life". By offering up his life for our salvation, Jesus reveals that the divine name – "I AM WHO I AM" – is also his name. Jesus explains it this way: "When you lift up the Son of Man, then you will know that I am he, and that I do nothing on my own. But just as the Father taught me, I say these things" (John 8:28, CSB). The God who revealed himself as "I AM WHO I AM" is the same God who offers us salvation through Jesus Christ. When we put our trust in Jesus, we put our trust in God.

He saw the ungodly ways of the Roman Catholic Church in those days. Only by faith and the grace of God are we saved. We too, have to stay awake and be alert. As followers of Christ, it is not always easy. But we look forward to an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade—kept in heaven for us.
