From the Pastor's Heart

Dear Family

October was such a grace-filled month for us as a congregation and – on a personal level – for myself and my family. My ordination as a pastor of the Christian Reformed Church in North America on October 2nd, 2022, was truly one of the highlights of my life thus far. I am deeply grateful to God for the opportunity to serve and lead a congregation such as Emo CRC. As my brothers and sisters in Christ, I implore you to always keep me in your prayers, since I am totally dependent on the grace of God to fulfil the calling God has given me. Pastoral ministry can be and often is spiritually challenging, thus the support of your prayers is extremely important to me.

As we think about Reformation Day this year (October 31, 2022), I remind you of the Reformers' emphasis on grace alone (sola gratia). One of the perennial challenges of the spiritual life is the need to remember that our perseverance as followers of Jesus does not depend on our own strength or works. As Paul writes to the believers in Ephesus, "For by grace you have been saved through faith." And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast" (Ephesians 2:8-9, ESV). As this verse highlights, even the faith we have is "the gift of God"! We truly have nothing to boast about. Every aspect of our relationship with God is the result of God's grace. Accordingly, as we proceed on the path of faith, let's never think our acceptance by God is somehow related to our level of holiness or the depth of our theological understanding. No, we enjoy a right relationship with God because of Christ alone (solus Christus), on the basis of Christ's saving work on the cross. Yes, as children of God, the fruit of the Spirit needs to be present in our lives, as Paul emphasises in his letter to the Galatians, but even this spiritual evidence of saving faith is the work of God's grace. Thus, we truly are a people of grace! It's my heartfelt prayer that our interactions with each other as brothers and sisters in Christ will always be marked by a profound awareness of this amazing grace.
