From the Pastor's Heart

Dear Family

Some of my earliest memories of my childhood go back to gatherings as a family over Christmas time. Sometimes it was the only time of year I got to see some family. My parents would take my brother and I to church on Christmas morning and then we would go back home where a big meal awaited. But what I remember even more than the food is the great conversations I enjoyed with family members. We would talk about our faith, about the latest family news, about some highlights from the past year, about so many things. And at some level we all knew our reason for gathering together was our celebration of the birth of Jesus. While we may not have realised it, our exchange of gifts was deeply meaningful from a theological perspective, highlighting the fact that Jesus is the Greatest Gift we've ever experienced. Moreover, the exchange of gifts reminded us of the generosity we're called to show towards each other all throughout the year. A generosity that brings us closer to other people, especially those who are hurting the most.

It's often been said that shepherds were quite marginalised in the context of first century Israel. It's not that they were excluded from the community, but they were not viewed as the kind of people you would want to hang out with. Yet, as was the case during Jesus' public ministry, Jesus' birth reaches out to the margins of society and draws people in. The Gospel of Luke, chapter 2, records how these shepherds were the first people to whom the birth of the King of Kings was announced. These marginalised people are the first ones invited to come and worship Jesus. As we think about Christmas time and we think about God the Father giving us the gift of Jesus, I wonder if the Lord may be inviting us to reach out to people on the margins, offering people the gift of Jesus. How do we do that? By inviting people into our lives and sharing the love of Jesus in the context of community. For some people, Christmas can be an extremely lonely time of year, even more so if the person is not part of a community of faith. May we offer people the gift of Jesus, God with us.

Those celebrating 40+ anniversaries are Henry & Thea Kaemingh (64th on the 19th) and Louis & Darlene Byma (48th on the 27th).



One of the things that we love about working for Wycliffe Bible Translators and SIL* is experiencing innovation firsthand and witnessing it contribute to the Kingdom of God. While these organizations have been around for many decades, they continue to lead innovation. These innovations are, in turn, deployed in service to the most marginalized peoples in the world. They enable better distribution of Scriptures. They enable communities to use their languages in today's digital world. SIL's technologies are generally behind the scenes, laying the foundation for many other ministries.

I, Justin, along with a colleague, recently had the great honour of accepting an innovation award on behalf of SIL's Language Technology Team. <u>Here</u> is the video of the award presentation at Missio Nexus.

Missio Nexus is an organization that brings together leaders from North American churches, mission agencies and businesses that are focused on the "Great Commission." They state their mission as "catalyzing relationships, ideas, and collaboration within the Great Commission Community." Each year they present the Excelerate Award to celebrate excellence, innovation and partnership. It was given to SIL's Language Technology Team for three of the many technologies they have developed.

- <u>Keyman</u> helps you type in over 2000 languages on just about any device Windows, macOS, Linux, iPhone, iPad, Android tablets and phones, and even instantly in your web browser.
- <u>Bloom</u> opens potential for anyone with minimal computer skills to quickly produce reading materials in any language and add it to a library accessible on a phone. There are currently 12,484 books in 531 languages in the Bloom library. During the recent pandemic it was used by agencies around the world to quickly produce and disseminate materials about the virus (373 books in 201 languages).
- <u>Scripture App Builder</u> allows users to build simple Bible apps with synchronized Scripture text and audio in local languages which can be easily shared.

These are just some of the various tools that are used today in the work of Bible translation and other development work related to languages.

Thank you for your prayers, for your interest in this work, and for your financial partnership with us so that all people can have access to the Word of God in a language they understand best.

The summer of 2022 flew by! In early July we drove to Alberta to celebrate Albert's parents' 60th wedding anniversary, coming back to Grand Rapids over Northwestern Ontario to spend a little time with Carolyn's family there. The TLT Action Plan

"This course was *practical*." We often hear this from those completing a Timothy Leadership Training (TLT) manual - whether on pastoral care, preaching, or any of the other six TLT courses. TLT is a CRC church leadership training program available in 30-plus languages, and used by churches in about forty countries.

So what is it that makes TLT practical? Usually the answer comes down to the Action Plan. The TLT Action Plan is the final assignment of each three-day course. For this assignment, every participant is required to create a three-four-month plan for how they will apply what they have learned.

After three-to-four months, they report back to their group what has happened by God's grace as a result of their Action Plan. Often real life has a way of modifying plans. But everyone reports: What did I do? What were the results? What did I learn?

The Impact of an Action Plan

Last month, a training group in Bangladesh shared this testimony, "After the training on stewardship, a pastor named Mithu made an Action Plan to help those who had suffered from



loss of work during COVID. Specifically, he encouraged those who had a good amount of land and crops to be faithful with their offerings. He taught about stewardship. He learned that some members had extra land; he talked with them, and some of them gave paddies to those in need. 13,000 Taka (about \$150) was collected to help those without work - even if they didn't come from the same religion. This made a strong impression. There are now more evangelistic opportunities to reach many unreached people..."

James 2:17 comes to mind: "...faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead." The TLT Action Plan is faith in action. Call it practical, if you will.

Prayer Request

After a two-and-a-half-year COVID delay, a group of 21 pastors from the Gereja Kristus Tuhan

church in Indonesia met for 5 days of TLT training in September 2022 to complete their final courses. Thank God for their achievement, pray as they now train others, and pray for the 150+ TLT groups globally who are back to their regular training activities.
